The St. Mary Parish Council met on this date in Regular Session with Chairperson Gwendolyn L. Hidalgo presiding and the following members present: Rev. Craig Mathews, J Ina, Rodney Olander, David W. Hill, Leslie “Les” Rulf, Jr., Patrick Hebert, James “Jimmy” Davis, Jr., Mark Duhon, Dean Adams, and Kristi Prejeant Rink, M.D. Absent was Chief Administrative Officer, Paul J. Governale.

The Invocation was pronounced by Mr. Olander and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Hill.

Mr. Olander moved that the reading of the Second Regular Meeting, March 25, 2026 be dispensed with and that the same be approved. Mr. Davis seconded the motion, which carried.

Jacob Bell appeared before the Council to discuss an update on “Save Our Children Mentoring Program.” He discussed their budget and the need for additional funding. He expounded on the need for more parent involvement, fundraisers, donations, building maintenance, and asked for help to obtain a grant writer. Several Council Members discussed researching the budget availability, funding, and building maintenance.

Parish President, Sam Jones expounded on the Parish’s deficit his first year as Parish President and thanked Mr. Bell for helping the children in the community.

Sherry Wilmore, A’Lyrach Jones, Tasia Briscoe, and Megan Lasserre, representatives, appeared before the Council to discuss the adoption of the proclamation recognizing “Black Maternal Health Week” to be observed on April 11 – 17, 2026. Ms. Wilmore expounded on the Healthy Start Program that services all mothers and that their contact number is 985-333-2020 and email is healthystart.org.

Mr. Adams requested to move up Item 14A, “Proclamation proclaiming April 11-17, 2026, as “Black Maternal Health Week.”

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Black Maternal Health Week is observed nationally each year from April 11 through April 17 to increase awareness and strengthen coordinated efforts to improve maternal and infant health outcomes; and

WHEREAS, Louisiana continues to experience one of the highest maternal mortality rates in the United States, with pregnancy-associated mortality ratios exceeding the national average and many pregnancy-related deaths in Louisiana have been identified as preventable, emphasizing the importance

of early and continuous prenatal care, timely postpartum care, and access to comprehensive, high-quality healthcare services; and

WHEREAS, data from the Louisiana Department of Health highlight areas where maternal health outcomes can be improved through expanded access to quality care and coordinated support services; and

WHEREAS, maternal and infant health outcomes are influenced by multiple factors, including access to healthcare, care coordination, transportation, chronic disease management, behavioral health needs, and other conditions that impact health and well-being and preterm birth and infant mortality rates in Louisiana remain higher than the national average and require continued collaboration across healthcare providers, public health agencies, and community-based organizations; and

WHEREAS, the federally funded Healthy Start program in St. Mary Parish works to reduce infant mortality and improve birth outcomes through outreach, care coordination, health education, support for postpartum and well-woman care, interconception health services, and initiatives that encourage and strengthen father and partner engagement; and

WHEREAS, the Healthy Start Community Consortium brings together program participants, residents, healthcare providers, social service agencies, faith-based organizations, and community leaders to guide program activities, identify service gaps, and ensure that strategies reflect the lived experiences, strengths, and priorities of the families served and the voices of program participants help shape solutions that improve access to care, strengthen service delivery, and promote accountability and sustainable, community-driven improvements in maternal and infant health; and

WHEREAS, St. Mary Parish is committed to supporting collaborative, community-informed approaches that improve access to care, strengthen systems of support, and promote safe and healthy pregnancies and births for mothers, infants, and families.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Parish President and Council of St. Mary Parish, Louisiana, do hereby recognize April 11–17, 2026, as

“Black Maternal Health Week”

in St. Mary Parish and encourage healthcare providers, community organizations, public health partners, businesses, faith leaders, and residents to work in partnership with the Healthy Start program and its Community Consortium to improve maternal health, increase access to postpartum and interconception care, support family well-being, and reduce preventable maternal and infant deaths.

Barry Dufrene, Home Rule Charter Revision Commission member, appeared before the Council to discuss the Home Rule Charter election date. Mr. Dufrene thanked the Council for creating a commission and not a committee to revise the Charter. He stated that the Charter was written 40 years ago and the only thing that was changed was term limits in 2014. He encouraged the Council to take the necessary steps to move the proposal forward in time for the fall election and begin the process of placing the item on the agenda so that the required steps such as drafting resolutions, holding public hearings, and informing the public can take place.

In response to several Council Members' inquiries, Dr. Rink stated that she spoke with Jason Akers regarding the November election date and its deadline.

Parish President, Sam Jones informed of available employment opportunities in the Parish. He stated that the issue is the lack of housing. Several Council Members also discussed the lack of proper infrastructure needed to support housing development.

Mrs. Hidalgo stated that Chief Administrative Officer, Paul J. Governale submitted a Report on the status of TE-168 Levee District from Michael Brocato relative to Pump Station No. 4, Pump Station No. 9, Pump Station No. 8, Pump Station No. 6, and GIS.

Mr. Hebert informed that he recently received exceptional service from Oschner St. Mary Hospital in Morgan City. He personally thanked Amanda Price, Chase Perry, Ms. Casey, Kimberly Neelan, and Dr. Karamoo of Oschner and also thanked Carlo Gagliano, Austin Guidry, and Darryl Davidson with Acadian Ambulance.

Mr. Hebert introduced the following Ordinances:

ORDINANCE NO.

An Ordinance levying and imposing a tax of 5.72 mills for the purpose of maintaining and supporting the St. Mary Parish Public Library and its branches as directed by a special election in the Parish of St. Mary, excluding the municipality of Morgan City, for the year 2026; and levying and imposing a forty-six hundredths (0.46) mills tax on all the property subject to taxation in the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana, excluding the City of Morgan City, for the year 2026.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the St. Mary Parish Council of the Parish of St. Mary, Louisiana, in a public meeting held on May 13, 2026, which meeting was conducted in accordance with the open meetings law and the additional requirements of Article VII, Section 23(C) of the Constitution, that the taxing authority voted to adopt and impose the following millage rate(s), on all taxable property shown on the official assessment roll for the year 2026, and when collected, the revenues from said taxes shall be used only for the specific purposes for which said taxes have been levied. Said millage rate(s) are:

Library Tax (Debt Service)	0.46

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Assessor of the Parish of St. Mary, shall extend upon the assessment roll for the year 2026 the taxes herein levied, and the tax collector of said Parish shall collect and remit the same to said taxing authority in accordance with law.

ORDINANCE NO.

An Ordinance levying a tax of 7.60 mills Parish Tax located outside the municipalities for all parochial purposes and segregating for local and parochial purposes and levying and imposing a 3.80 mills tax located within the municipalities to help defray the expenses of the Criminal Justice System of the Parish of St. Mary, State of Louisiana.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the St. Mary Parish Council of the Parish of St. Mary, Louisiana, in a public meeting held on May 13, 2026, which meeting was conducted in accordance with the open meetings law and the additional requirements of Article VII, Section 23(C) of the Constitution, that the following millage rate(s) be and they are hereby levied upon the dollar of the assessed valuation of all property subject to ad valorem taxation within said Parish and within the incorporated municipalities and towns within the Parish for the year 2026, for the purpose of raising revenue:

In response to several Council Members’ inquiries, President Jones stated that this is regarding the Amelia Belle Casino in Amelia. He stated that a 10 year agreement was negotiated with an option of an additional 10 year agreement and that the flat fee is based on net gaming proceeds.

A. We received the following financial statements:

B. Shayla Anderson, owner of Stable Lounge, LLC, leasee of Columbia Talmore, Jr., located at 300 Bosco Road., Jeanerette, Louisiana (formally Queen Bee Daiquiris & Game Tyme) requests a residency variance to obtain a 2026 Full Liquor Permit.

Mr. Adams moved to grant the 2026 residency variance for Shayla Anderson, owner of the Stable Lounge, LLC, leasee of Columbia Talmore, Jr., located at 300 Bosco Road., Jeanerette, Louisiana (formally Queen Bee Daiquiris & Game Tyme). Dr. Rink seconded the motion.

In response to Rev. Mathews' inquiry, Assistant Clerk of the Council, Roshonda Bourgeois explained that the residency variance is to allow for issuance of a liquor permit. She stated that Ms. Anderson has obtained an electrical permit from the Planning & Zoning Department to have electricity turned on.

Rev. Mathews stated that he has received several calls from residents in opposition of having a bar re-open at this location.

After discussion, Mr. Adams withdrew his motion to grant the 2026 residency variance for Shayla Anderson, owner of the Stable Lounge, LLC, leasee of Columbia Talmore, Jr., located at 300 Bosco Road., Jeanerette. Dr. Rink withdrew her second.

Rev. Mathews moved to table the 2026 residency variance request for Shayla Anderson, owner of the Stable Lounge, LLC, leasee of Columbia Talmore, Jr., located at 300 Bosco Road., Jeanerette, to the April 22, 2026 agenda. Mr. Ina seconded the motion, which carried.

- C. Discussion and action pursuant to Ordinance No. 2152 which provides that any member of any Board of Commissioners appointed by the Parish who shall miss three (3) meetings in any twelve (12) month period of time without good cause stated to the Parish Council shall be terminated from the Board of Commissioners. The intent of the ordinance is to have people serving on these boards that have the time and willingness to attend meetings so as to ensure that a quorum would be met to conduct business that may come before the board. On March 3, 2026, a letter was sent to Ms. Patsy W. Powell informing her that a commissioner who misses three meetings within a twelve-month period without good cause shall be terminated. I have not heard back from this board member.

Clerk of the Council, Lisa Morgan explained that this pertains to the Tourist Commission and that no action can be taken per Revised Statute 33:4574, Tourist Commissions creation, purpose, directors, and powers.

- D. Mr. Hill to discuss the new street signs going up across St. Mary Parish.

Mr. Hill stated that residents are complaining that DOTD is replacing existing stop signs and installing new signs in school zones within the Parish that are 7 feet tall, which is a safety concern. He explained that this is a DOTD project with no cost to the Parish.
